Review Key Concepts

- 1. Sample answer: joy you feel welcoming a child into the world; opportunity to develop new skills and strengths; and the chance to pass on traditions.
- 2. Children go from defiant at 18 months to affectionate at 2 years. At 2½, children often feel frustrated but then happy and eager to please by 3. At 3½, children are often fearful and insecure.
- 3. Newborns sleep just a few hours at a time, and they need to be fed and diapered ten to twelve times a day.
